**Re: Summerlea Storm Surchage Relief  
Schedule Update**

Dear Resident,

I am writing on behalf of the City of Edmonton to provide an update on the Summerlea Storm Surchage Relief project. A public information session to discuss the Summerlea Storm Surchage Relief Project was held on March 3, 2015, which you attended. This outlined the proposed construction of a large diameter pipe from an existing trunk sewer along 95 Avenue into an existing stormwater management facility (the Terra Rosa Pond). This project is being completed to reduce the risk of flooding within the Summerlea neighbourhood. At this time, it was heard that residents were concerned about the impacts this project would have on traffic, maintaining habitat for the existing wildlife and walking paths. The design team has taken these considerations into account.

Unfortunately, the schedule as presented in the Open House will no longer be met. It is likely no surprise to you that construction on the relief pipe has not begun in summer 2015, as expected. Therefore, the project is not expected to be complete in the spring of 2016. The delay has been due to land acquisition requirements. The City is hoping to resolve these issues as soon as possible and move ahead with the construction plans. Prior to the beginning of construction in your neighbourhood, Sameng and the City will host another public information session to provide updated information on the project as well as an updated schedule.
