Snow Removal Tips

3. Dress for the weather and protect your hands against blisters.

Snow Removal Supports

Disabled or mobility challenged?

This year, the City is offering snow removal assistance for residents who have a permanent or temporary disability. To apply, you will need a form signed by an authorized health care provider that confirms that you cannot perform any activities related to snow removal.

NOTE: Low-income seniors can also receive snow removal assistance through the Government of Alberta's Special Needs Assistance program.

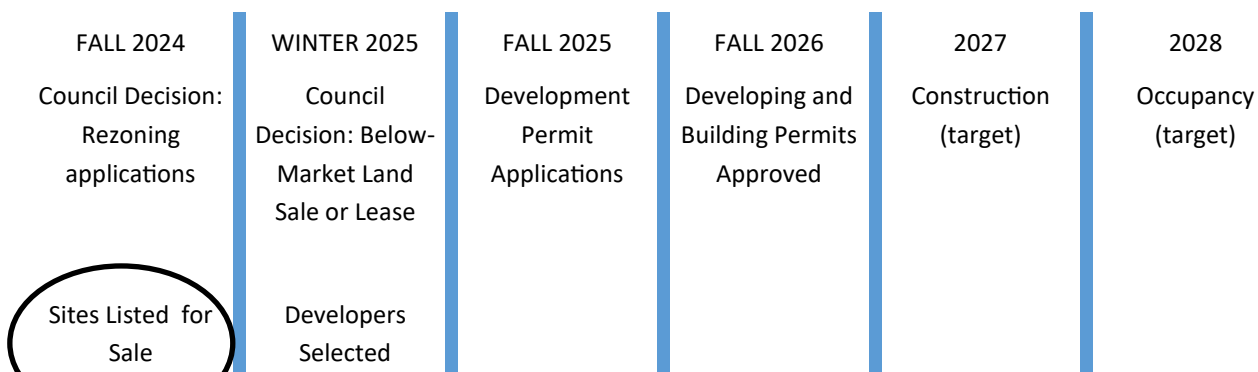
Land Swap and Affordable Housing

Great news! The City of Edmonton has approved the Land Swap of the surplus school site (the corner of the park at 93 Avenue and 175 Street) with a portion of the park immediately north of the hotel (the "subject property"). This means we get the good corner added to our park space, and the City gets a section which almost no one uses for Affordable Housing.



Next, the City's Real Estate and Housing team will review proposals from developers. They will look for length and depth of affordability of non-market units, financial viability of the applicant, energy efficiency, and accessibility.

Applicants must also outline their communications and engagement approach. Evaluations and developer selection will take place this winter.
